## **Considerations for Restart at our Jobsites (non-Company owned)**

Some requirements to limit the spread of the Covid-19 virus are determined by the facility owner and would be implemented accordingly. Additional considerations that may be put in place to at our jobsites would include:

- Stagger shift start times and breaks/lunch.
- Establish aisles and entryways in approach to turnstiles.
- Utilize spacing aids on the ground to help with social distancing.
- Have supervisors or assigned social-distance ambassadors monitor employee distancing.
- Administer temperature screenings prior to entering jobsite.
- Incorporate pertinent COVID-19 information into Safety Meetings daily. Scheduling and conducting multiple meetings may be required if staggering shift start times. Conduct safety meetings and JSA meetings in small crews no more than 10 people, and maintain social distancing. Do not track attendance through passed around sign-in sheets.
- Divide crews into small groups if possible and maintain those work crews indefinitely to limit the number of employees that might be quarantined.
- Ensure that handwashing and sanitizer stations are readily available throughout the site. Provide hand sanitizer stations outside each restroom and each door that is commonly touched or used;
- Perform additional cleaning and disinfecting throughout the day.
- Clean and disinfect tools and equipment that could be used by more than one person after each use. If practical, assign tools and equipment to individuals.
- Prominently post signs to remind employees to maintain social distancing and to use good personal hygiene.
- Configure all areas where employees gather; lunch/break areas, water cooler, smoke pens, cool down stations; to easily social distance people at least 6 feet apart. No more than 2 employees to a picnic table. Put a "X" with tape on lunch tables and benches noting where employees can sit to ensure proper distancing. If necessary, add partitions to tables.
- Establish designated one-way lanes in hallways and lunch/break areas to avoid "head-on" pedestrian traffic.
- Encourage employees to minimize ride sharing to and from work.
- Limit riders in an onsite regular cab pickup truck to no more than 2 people.
- Limit riders in a van or bus to no more than 1 person per bench seat. Maximum 10 people per trip.

## **Iobsite Buildings/Trailers**

- Employees must complete the Covid-19 Training prior to returning to the office environment.
  - Training will be web-based and available on the Turner E-Learning Management System
- If possible, identify one main entrance.
- Limit the entry to these buildings/trailers to essential personnel only.
- Limit the travel between buildings/trailers as much as possible.
- Set up a cleaning and disinfecting station for any equipment and any other items that were removed from the jobsite.

- A cleaning and disinfecting station for computer equipment and other items will be established at a designated entry point. Any equipment brought into building must go through a disinfection process. If equipment leaves the building it will have to be disinfected each time it is returned.
  - Employees will be responsible for the cleaning of their equipment. Cleaning instructions will be posted near the cleaning station.
  - Gloves and appropriate cleaning products will be provided
- Remind employees to maintain regular housekeeping practices in their immediate space, including routine cleaning and disinfecting of surfaces, equipment, and other elements of the work environment.
- If applicable, elevators will be limited to two people. Employees awaiting elevators should maintain 6-foot social distance.
- Limit occupants in restrooms to one person for every other stall.
- Where possible, employees should remain in their assigned work areas or assigned floor during the workday. Exceptions to this practice might include when accessing lunch areas or conducting business-critical activities in another area.
- Lunch/break areas can be occupied by one person at a time or must be configured to easily social
  distance people at least 6 feet apart. Occupancy of break and lunch areas should be determined
  based on ability to maintain a minimum 6 feet between occupants.
- If open work areas do not allow for 6 feet of social distancing, then partitions (i.e. plastic shields or cubicle walls) must be installed.
- Face coverings are recommended when walking through or into common areas such as hallways, restrooms, lunch/break rooms, copy rooms, conference rooms, etc. Face coverings are not required in single office occupancy settings.
  - Training on the proper use and care of face coverings is contained in the company's Covid-19 Training

## **Close Proximity Work**

There are some work tasks that will make it difficult to maintain the 6-foot distancing rule. These tasks will be identified during the job planning phase so it can be noted on the JSA that additional PPE will be required. If the 6-foot social distancing requirement cannot be met, employees must wear some type of face covering or filtering facepiece respirator (N95/KN95 or other). This does not replace the requirement to use respiratory protection that is required to protect against hazardous atmospheres (i.e. dust, mists, fumes or  $O_2$  deficient). Some examples of Close Proximity work include:

- Bolting/Unbolting Flanges
- Confined Space Work
- Pump and Exchanger Repair
- Scaffold Work
- Lifting Equipment (I.E. Piping, Valves, Etc.)
- Insulation Activities
- Inspection Work
- Civil Work (I.E. Tying Rebar, Pouring Concrete)

- Aerial Lift/Personnel Lift (When Requires Two People for Work Task)
- Fabricating Pipe

Things to consider when close proximity work cannot be avoided.

- Make sure everyone involved in the task understands the work task prior to moving within 6 feet of each other to start work
- Remind employees to minimize the time in close proximity with other workers
- Have hand washing facilities or hand sanitizer readily available so that employees can clean and disinfect their hands thoroughly before and after the work task
- Evaluate employees' face coverings to assess whether they are clean and fit well this will reduce the need for adjustments or touching of their face.
